

History

Lord Howe Island was discovered by Lieutenant Henry Lidgbird Ball, commander of His Majesty's tender SUPPLY on 17 February 1788 while the vessel was enroute to Norfolk Island. Lieutenant Ball named the island in honour of Lord Howe - First Lord of the Admiralty 1783-1788. In his journal Ball noted that turtles were numerous on the sandy beach within the lagoon and could be taken with little effort. Ball's account and chart of the island were published in The Voyage of Governor Phillip to Botany Bay in London in 1789.
