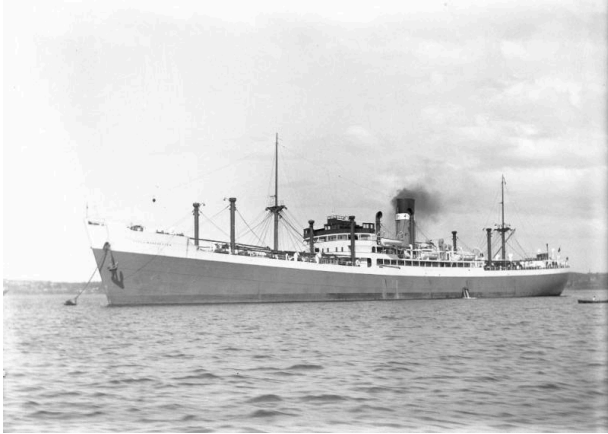

History

CITY OF MANCHESTER was a 5,527 ton cargo and passenger vessel, the fourth to be given the name of City of Manchester. Built in 1935 by Cammell, Laird at Birkenhead it was a steel twin-screw merchant ship. On 28 February 1942 CITY OF MANCHESTER was torpedoed by a Japanese submarine off Java.
